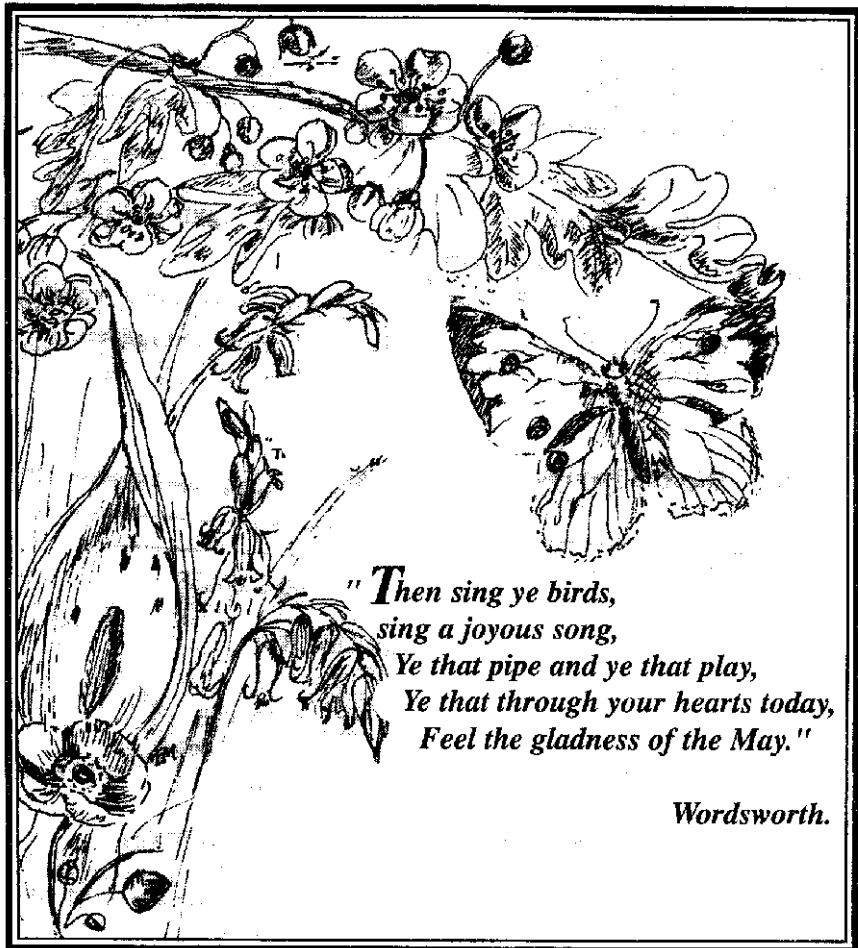

RECTOR'S RAMBLES

This year May is a month of preparation for celebrations. The planning for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee is well under way around the country. Within this magazine you will find details of some of the local events planned which link into the national events.

As part of the overall celebrations *The Queen's Green Canopy* (QGC) is inviting people from across the United Kingdom to "**Plant a Tree for the Jubilee**". Planting a tree is a sign of hope for future generations as many of us will not be around when that tree achieves its potential.

As well as inviting the planting of new trees, a network of 70 Ancient Woodlands will be dedicated across the United Kingdom and 70 Ancient Trees will be identified to celebrate Her Majesty's 70 years of service. I understand Ancient Woodlands are areas of woodland that have persisted since 1600 in England and Wales and, having looked at the map there are more in our area than I realised. If only the trees could talk about events they have witnessed in their lives! And isn't it wonderful that even more areas will get protection for future generations to enjoy?

I know some people do not believe in having a monarchy but let's leave that debate aside and focus on the Queen herself. In a world full of upheaval she has been a constant for many people throughout their lives. Some can remember the pomp and circumstance of her Coronation, others have memories that include the Silver Jubilee and more recently the Golden and Diamond Jubilees. As well as celebrating her role as of Head of State many of us will be honouring her position as Head of the Church of England, a duty we know she takes very seriously. She leads by example with a quiet but strong faith underpinning her life.

When she became the longest serving monarch a prayer was written to mark the occasion which feels appropriate to use again:

Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ exchanged the glory of a heavenly throne for the form of a servant, we thank you that you have given Elizabeth our Queen a heart to serve her people, and have kept her devoted in this service beyond all who were before her: Encourage us by her example to serve one another, and to seek the common good, until you call us all to reign with Christ in your eternal kingdom. At the time of writing (before Easter) the official website doesn't yet give exact timings, so we will confirm missing details on posters around the village and on Facebook.

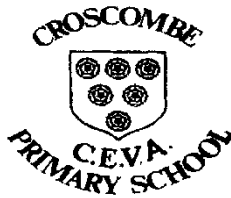
