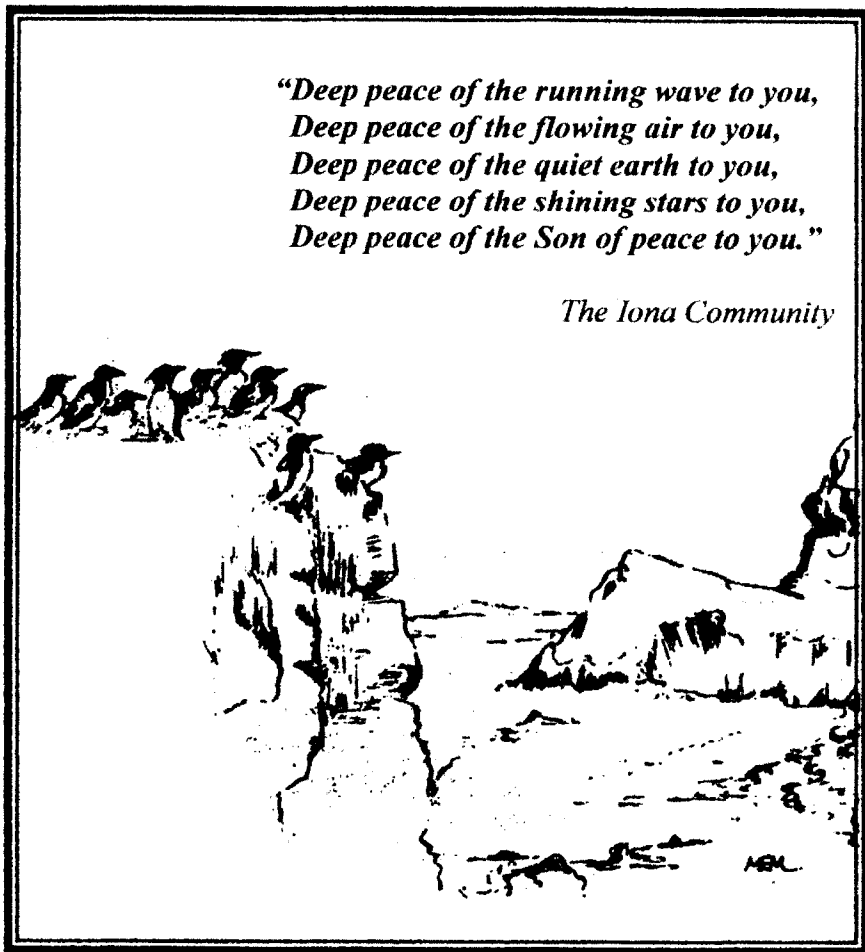

CROSCOMBE GROUP FLOOD MEETING, held on June 17th.

We had a high level of interest and some good discussions. Dr Paul Elliston from the Somerset Rivers Authority explained his role as liaison with the SRA, Environment Agency and Somerset Council. He took away several questions and we are actively reviewing his responses.

After the recent survey of the main culvert a meeting with a geomorphologist has been arranged for mid-July to discuss the buildup of rubble at various points along the river including the culvert.

We have met up with the Shepton Flood Group and discussed ideas around reducing peak flows during high rainfall. We are pleased to say that the large pond at Kilver Court is due to be de-silted in August and has had a water level monitor fitted similar to the one in Croscombe. The Environment Agency is working on creating a flood alert system based on these monitors that would provide instant alerts when river levels start to rise.

We will be asking Tessa Munt to ask for her support in helping to reduce the risk and impact of flooding along the Sheppey.

After many inland waterway holidays on a narrow boat, John Stower and his wife, Ann, thought they'd like to venture further. So they bought a catamaran, and struck out into the Mediterranean – as you do – not returning for two and a half years.

They had their share of misfortune, such as the Spanish directions, on a tin of glue bought for much needed repairs, losing all their bank details overboard, a close encounter with a submarine, of which they were quite unaware, and a storm lasting five days in Corfu. The people they met, however, gave them their happiest moments. In Spain entire families from great-grandparents to babies spent their evenings in the market square, just enjoying one another's company. T.V.? What's that??

The Spanish, Italians and Croatians were all friendly and helpful, not so the French and English harbour communities. They made friends with a party of young men who had sailed all the way from New Zealand and were worrying about the Bay of Biscay ahead! As it transpired, that was calm for them, so they all made it safely to England.

We could only admire their pluck.

In **July**, we were very pleased to have Richard Raynesford and his wife Janet back to show us some more slides, this time of historic buildings in Somerset. With his Planning Officer's sharp eye for detail, he showed us close-ups of medieval churches etc. we would never normally notice from the ground, explaining their history and significance, and sometimes surprising us. I never knew, for instance, that there was an effigy of a Bishop in Wells Cathedral still with his original paint and gilding intact, looking like the whole of the West front would have looked before the Puritan era. We saw a bat carved into the roof of our own St Mary's, a corrugated iron church at Emborough, a nineteenth century wooden verandahed cottage in Sharpham (so built because it stood on peaty ground), a 3-cornered Lychgate roof at Kilmersdon, and so much more of interest. Thank you, Richard, for being such a very engaging speaker.

The Parish Council would like your feedback on this year's Festival. We think some of the changes we discussed with GFEL did make a difference this year, but we are always looking to improve the situation for parishioners. Please send your comments, good or bad, and any suggestions for improvements you have directly to clerk@piltonparishcouncil.org. We will review everything ahead of our October review meeting with GFEL, which you are invited to attend.

Thanks to the efforts of PPC, in the most part Cllr Tom Hollings, the traffic working group and GFEL we now have permanent 20 mph throughout Pilton village, including the A361 in the heart of the village. With the help of East Compton residents, we were able to get a reduction from 60mph to 50, through the hamlet. This was great teamwork and was massively helped by the funding of GFEL. I personally would like to thank all involved in hopefully helping to make Pilton Parish a safer place to live. We will continue to look at ways we can improve safety particularly on the A361.
