

RECTOR'S RAMBLES

February brings the beginning of Lent. Just before Lent begins we have Shrove Tuesday, or Pancake Day as we also call it. This year it falls on 21st February.

I don't know about you but I am always fascinated by the history and traditions behind these days. In the Church Lent commemorates the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness before he began his earthly ministry. In Anglo Saxon times it was the day everyone went to the Church to be Shriven, to be absolved from their sins before entering the Lenten fast. It was also a time to use up all the rich food like eggs and butter before fasting through Lent, hence pancakes.

Connected with Pancake Day are pancake races; traditionally they are said to have started in Olney in Buckinghamshire. It is said that in 1445 a woman heard the shriving bell while she was making pancakes and ran to the church in her apron, still clutching her frying pan. I don't know if it is true or not but what a great picture, and anyone would be welcome in our churches with pancakes! The Olney pancake race is now world famous (although I should confess at this point that I was not really aware of it).

Today many pancake races still happen and in addition people give up various things in lent, often chocolate. I wonder if we should consider fasting from other things, maybe foods with the greatest environmental cost? Whatever we give up, maybe we could also consider making an extra donation to charity as well, if you can afford it.

This year our headlines are around the struggle many people are having to provide food and fuel for their family. Many in our country are struggling and there are many great charities out there, whether you want to support one of the local food banks or help those in fuel poverty, which you can do by various charities including the Fuel Bank Foundation <https://www.fuelbankfoundation.org/>. If you find you are one of the many people struggling to pay for your fuel it is also a useful link to see if they are able to help you.

Enjoy your pancakes and whatever you give up, or take up, I pray you have a blessed Lent.

We were delighted to see over 50 members and visitors at our January meeting, for a fascinating talk on ‘The Monmouth Rebellion’. If you missed it, you can still watch a recording. Phone for details 890357.

Our next meeting on **Monday 13th February** at 7.30pm in Pilton Village Hall is our short AGM, followed by another treat to look forward to...

The talk is entitled “Land of the Summer People”, being near enough to the Saxon meaning of the name Somerset.

Iain Miles is very knowledgeable about this wet old county of ours, and will be telling us all about the history of the draining of the Levels of the central Somerset Plain, (Sedgemoor, The Brue and Axe Valleys), up until the events of 2014 and the reason why the county floods.

He is the Hon. President of the Westonzoyland Engine Trust, the Group that runs the Pumping Station Museum near Westonzoyland, preserving the 1831 building which housed the first steam land drainage engine in the county. The replacement engine of 1861, made by the firm of Easton and Amos, ran until replaced by a diesel pump in 1951.

The Trust was formed by some Somerset Industrial Archaeology Society members in 1977 and, after installing a modern boiler, they have opened it regularly to the public, whilst running both it and other machines brought on to the site.
